GLOSSARY of TERMS & ABBREVIATIONS USED

Anon: Abbreviation for anonymous. Used when the name of a photographer of an image is unknown.

Attributed: Used when various clues suggest that a photograph was taken by a known photographer.

Boudoir: Photo on 5" x 8 ½" mount.

Cabinet: Photo measuring 4" x 5 ½" on a 4 ½" x 6 ½" mount.

CDV: Abbreviation for Carte de Visite, usually a 2 ¼" x 3 ½" image on a 2 ½" x 4" mount.

Circa: Approximate date when photograph was taken.

Half Plate: 4 ½" x 5 ½"

Mammoth and/or Mammoth Plate: A print from a large glass-plate negative, usually 18" x 20", although the sizes did vary.

nd: No apparent date of when a photograph was taken and/or printed.

Quarter Plate: 2 ¾" x 3 ¼"

Salt Print: Print made on plain paper treated with salt before printing from a glass negative, circa 1850s. Salt prints lack the glossy appearance of many of the later photographic printing processes.

Sixth Plate: 2" x 2 ½"

SV: Abbreviation for stereoview.

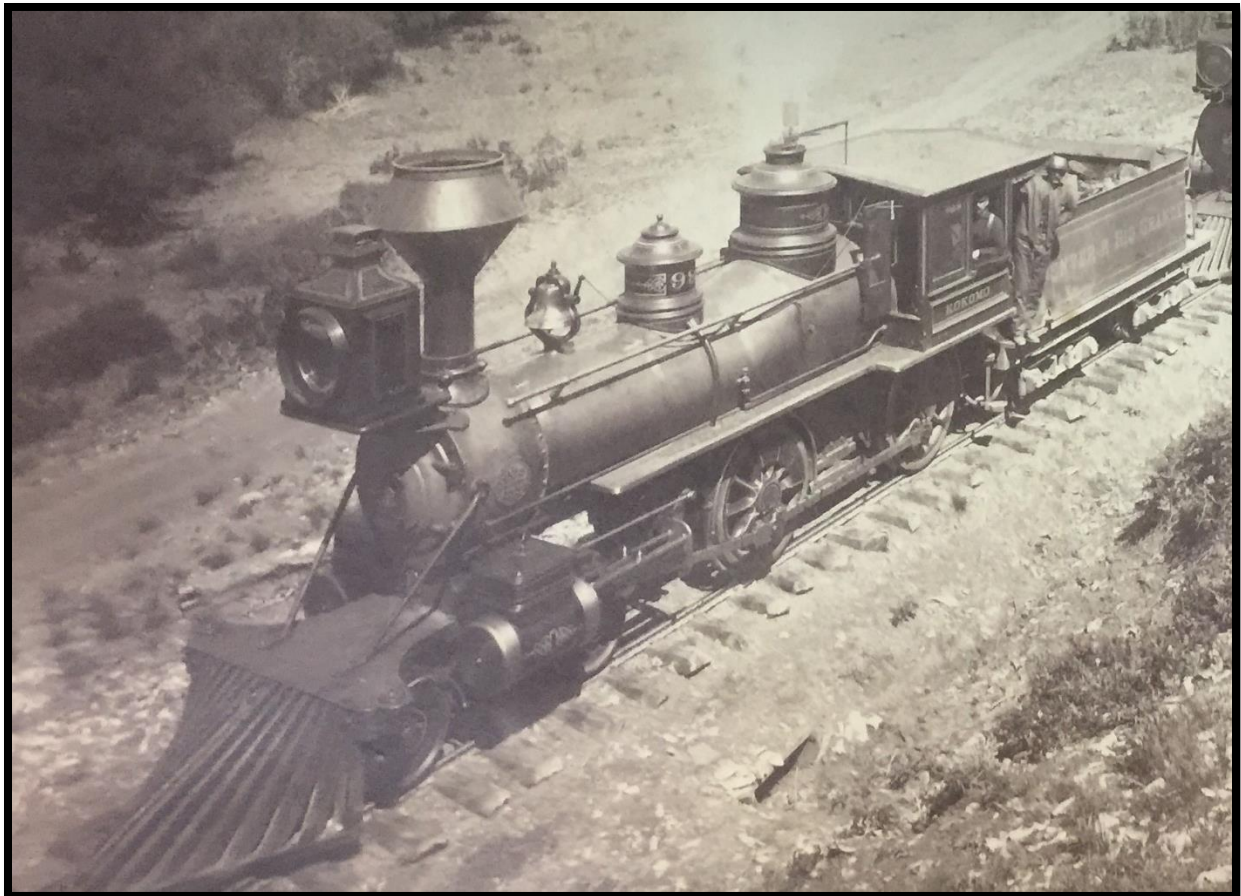
